# Golden Crown





This is the perfect craft for a princess themed birthday party or a craft at events such as Girl Scout meetings. I had my Daisy troop makes these to wear at our end of year ceremony as "graduation" hats.

#### **MATERIALS NEEDED**

All materials shown are from Stampin' Up and page numbers are from the 2011-2012 Idea Book & Catalog unless otherwise indicated. Items can be purchased on my Stampin' Up website: <a href="http://denagillis.stampinup.net">http://denagillis.stampinup.net</a>

- 8-1/2 x 11 Cardstock: Brushed Gold (page 181), Daffodil Delight (page 177), Concord Crush (page 176), Melon Mambo (page 177), and Tempting Turquoise (page 177)
- SNAIL Adhesive (page 206) and Multipurpose Liquid Glue (page 206) or Sticky Strip (page 206)
- Punches: Fancy Flower (page 210), Butterfly (page 210), 1" Circle (page 212), and Eyelet Border (page 211)

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Cut a piece of Brushed Gold cardstock into 3-1/2 inch x 11 inch pieces. This will create two strips of paper.
- 2. Attach the two strips with the SNAIL Adhesive to create one long piece of 3-1/2 inch x 21 inch cardstock.
- 3. Use your favorite border punch to create a decorative edge on one side. I used the Eyelet Border punch on this project.
- 4. Use your punches on your cardstock to create the embellishments: 1" circle on the Daffodil Delight, Butterfly and Fancy Flower on the other colors.

- 5. Take the crown and wrap it around the head of each child. Some may require an extender to be added. You can use the excess gold cardstock to cut a 3-1/2 inch x 2 to 3 inch extender. Attach to one end of the crown but do not attach the crown into a circle yet. It is a good idea to have each child write their name on the inside before they begin to decorate them.
- 6. Give each child a glue stick or use the Sticky Strip. Depending on the age of the children, it is best to show them a crown that you have already made so that they know where to attach their various embellishments.
- 7. Once completed, you can use the SNAIL Adhesive to complete the circle of the crown.
